The mission of United Against Fentanyl is to interrupt the use of illicit fentanyl through innovative bold, and effective initiatives.

One of those initiatives is called *Walk for Lives*—community events that provide lifesaving awareness education, and resources.

The inaugural events were held nationwide on Saturday, September 20th, 2025.

Each was led by a bereaved family member.

OVERVIEW



National grassroots campaigns that combine survivor stories, evidence-based education, and practical resources are proven ways to bring dramatic change. Mothers Against Drunk Driving pioneered this model by pairing testimonies with data and advocacy. Research shows that this form of coordinated narrative messaging changes individual choices, strengthens coalitions, and brings lasting change. MADD literally changed culture with respect to drinking and driving.

Walk For Lives is the first such effort utilizing that model but focusing on the fentanyl crisis, now the leading cause of death in the U.S. for people under 50. The inaugural September 20 campaign brought together more than 40 communities nationwide, generated over 26 million media and social impressions, reached over 3 million people on social platforms, and drove more than 3,000 virtual sign-ups, as survivors and families led the way.

Overall reach totaled over twenty-six million.


